


Wrapping up the School-Based Prevention Program Year:



A Quick Look at Our Outcomes



This school year, we reached nearly 1,800 students across, 164 classrooms, in 11 schools throughout Cattaraugus County, spanning grades K–8!

Through the Too Good for Drugs program, we implemented comprehensive lessons that emphasized the importance of making positive decisions and advocating for a healthy, substance—free lifestyle.

Our team worked closely with students to equip them with the knowledge and skills necessary to resist peer pressure and make informed choices that benefit their long–term well–being.

Additionally, we engaged with 72 students in the Teen Intervene program, achieving 67 successful completions throughout the county.
